On Sunday 19th January musician (The Kik) and writer Marcel Groenewegen will open 'Forelands', a duo exhibition by Jan Doms and Han Klinkhamer. The latter lives and works very close to the great rivers with the flood plains (forelands) as a natural biotope. It is a landscape that offers continual challenge to his artistic ambition and abilities. Searching and feeling his way he sets the impressions gained during long walks in paint or ink on linen or paper. Sometimes the motifs of landscape dominate, or then vegetation,

but he is always searching the borderline between figurative and abstract. So it is that the title of the exhibition refers both to the metaphorical sense and the physical fact that each spring the rivers burst their banks and bring about a metamorphosis in the landscape. Artists too, search for boundaries and transcend these, in the conceptual or physical sense, but also in the way of interdisciplinarity. The multi-talented Jan Doms is the personification of this. With ease he brings together monumental work with

an intimate format, the two dimensional with the spatial, the constructivist with the poetic. Just like the Russian avant-garde of the start of the last century with just as much ease he uses literary, cinematographic, musical or theatrical means. With his unconventional performances he goes beyond the well-trodden paths.
